Title Local Authority Mortgage Rates

1. Executive Summary

1.1 The rates charged for council mortgages are determined by statute. These rates are reviewed and reported on every 6 months.

2. Recommended Decision

2.1 To set the locally determined interest rate applicable to council mortgages effective from 1 April 2021 at 3.33%.

3. Reasons for Recommended Decision

- 3.1 The Housing Act 1985 specifies how local authorities must set interest rates on mortgages arranged since 3 October 1980. Authorities must charge the higher of:
 - the Standard National Rate (SNR), set by the Secretary of State, based on interest rates currently charged by various lenders; or
 - the Locally Determined Rate (LDR), which is the applicable local average rate, based on the authority's own borrowing costs.
- The Secretary of State last reduced the SNR of interest from 3.93% to 3.13% with effect from 1 April 2009, after taking into account trends in mortgage lending rates. No further notification about the SNR has been received.
- 3.3 The LDR has been determined as 3.33% which is inclusive of the 0.25% administrative charge.
- 3.4 As the LDR rate is higher than the SNR's rate, the LDR can be charged.

4. Alternative Options

4.1 There are no alternative options. The rate payable is determined through statute.

5. Background Information

- 5.1 The LDR rate is set every six months and is affected by the interest rates paid on loans taken by the Council. The Council has recently paid off a loan which carried a high interest rate, therefore the LDR has now reduced from 4.53%, to 3.33%.
- 5.2 The Council currently has 7 outstanding accounts. 3 mortgages and 4 shared ownership.
