Terms of Reference

Strategic Overview and Scrutiny Panel

- To review corporate strategies.
- To ensure the actions of the Cabinet accord with the policies and budget of the Council.
- To monitor and scrutinise the financial performance of the Council, and make recommendations to the Cabinet particularly in relation to annual revenue and capital guidelines, bids and submissions.
- To link the Council's spending proposals to the policy priorities and review progress towards achieving those priorities against the Strategic / Action Plans.
- To scrutinise executive decisions made by Cabinet, the East Essex Area Waste Management Joint Committee, the Colchester and Ipswich Joint Museums Committee and Cabinet Member decisions (with delegated authority taking a corporate / strategic decision) which have been made but not implemented, and referred to the Panel through call-in.
- To monitor the Council's operational performance in relation to the Strategic Plan, Local Area Agreement targets and National Indicators.
- To scrutinise the Cabinet's performance in relation to the Forward Plan and to scrutinise the performance of Portfolio Holders.
- At the request of the Cabinet, make decisions about the priority of referrals made in the event of the volume of reports to the Cabinet or creating difficulty for the running of Cabinet business or jeopardising the efficient running of Council business.
- The panel will be the appropriate route for any member to refer a 'local government matter' in the context of Councillor Call for Action.

Process for Councillor Call for Action

- Councillors have the ability to call for debate and discussion a topic of neighbourhood concern, limited to issues affecting a single ward, in an attempt to bring about specific solutions for local problems. This enables members to get things done without going through the Council's executive decision making process.
- Members may bring an action on any issue they choose, with exceptions, for example, if the issue is vexatious or deals with an individual complaint. Local Government matters specifically excluded from the regime are namely matters relating to a planning decision, a licensing decision or where a right of recourse to a review or right of appeal is already provided for in law.
- Poor service performance or increased anti-social behaviour are examples of where a member will bring an action to the panel's attention.
- The scrutiny panel may reject a request as not within the guidance, or the usual channels have not been exhausted, or accept that an investigation is the appropriate action.
- The panel may conduct an investigation in the usual scrutiny manner, seeking information from the Council and/or partners and inviting them to attend meetings.
- A report with recommendations will be compiled and brought to the Council and/or partners attention, with the Council and/or partners having a duty to respond.
- The panel will consider and publish the responses to their recommendations and feed back this information to the Councillor calling for the action.

2. Substitutions

Members may arrange for a substitute councillor to attend a meeting on their behalf, subject to prior notice being given. The attendance of substitute councillors must be recorded.

3. Urgent Items

To announce any items not on the agenda which the Chairman has agreed to consider because they are urgent and to give reasons for the urgency.

4. Declarations of Interest

The Chairman to invite Councillors to declare individually any personal interests they may have in the items on the agenda.

If the personal interest arises because of a Councillor's membership of or position of control or management on:

- any body to which the Councillor has been appointed or nominated by the Council; or
- another public body

then the interest need only be declared if the Councillor intends to speak on that item.

If a Councillor declares a personal interest they must also consider whether they have a prejudicial interest. If they have a prejudicial interest they must leave the room for that item.

If a Councillor wishes to make representations on an item on which they have a prejudicial interest they may do so if members of the public are allowed to make representations. In such circumstances a Councillor must leave the room immediately once they have finished speaking.

An interest is considered to be prejudicial if a member of the public with knowledge of the relevant facts would reasonably regard it as so significant that it is likely to prejudice the Councillor's judgement of the public interest.

Councillors should consult paragraph 7 of the Meetings General Procedure Rules for further guidance.

5. Have Your Say!

(a) The Chairman to invite members of the public to indicate if they wish to speak or present a petition at this meeting – either on an item on the agenda or on a general matter not on this agenda. You should indicate your wish to speak at this point if your name has not been noted by Council staff.

(b) The Chairman to invite contributions from members of the public who wish to Have Your Say! on a general matter not on this agenda.

6. Items requested by members of the Panel and other Members

(a) To evaluate requests by members of the Panel for an item relevant to the Panel's functions to be considered.

(b) To evaluate requests by other members of the Council for an item relevant to the Panel's functions to be considered.

Members of the panel may use agenda item 'a' (all other members will use agenda item 'b') as the appropriate route for referring a 'local government matter' in the context of the Councillor Call for Action to the panel. Please refer to the panel's terms of reference for further procedural arrangements.

7. Referred items under the Call in Procedure

To consider any decisions taken under the Call in Procedure.

The panel may a) confirm the decision, which may then be implemented immediately, b) refer the decision back to the decision taker for further consideration setting out in writing the nature of its concerns, or c) refer the matter to full Council in the event that the panel considers the decision to be contrary to the Policy Framework of the Council or contrary to, or not wholly in accordance with the Budget.

8. Decisions taken under special urgency provisions

To consider any Portfolio Holder decisions taken under the special urgency provisions.

The Panel is invited to review the work of the Colchester Partnership for the London 2012 Olympic & Paralympic Games

1. Action required

1.1 The panel is asked to consider the work and progress of the Colchester Partnership for the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games

2. Reason for scrutiny

2.1 The London 2012 Olympic & Paralympic Games present a once in a lifetime opportunity to:

- Encourage more local people to participate in sport and lead healthy active lifestyles
- Raise the profile of sport in Colchester
- Lead to the development of new specialist sports facilities, such as a state of the art gym at the University and adiZone in Monkwick, which can be used by the local community for years after the Games
- Attract athletes from visiting nations to use sporting facilities in Colchester to prepare for the Games
- Attract visitors to the area before, during and after the Games
- Provide opportunities for local businesses to tender for services before and during the games, including the use of hotels, for example
- Help communities to grow and encourage them to get involved with the Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, creating a real wealth of experiences and memories that will last for decades and be handed on through future generations.

3. Background information

3.1 The Colchester Partnership for the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games was set up in 2006 by Colchester2020, the Local Strategic Partnership. Chaired by Dr Tony Rich (University of Essex Registrar), the Partnership meets 3-4 times a year and has the aim to secure the best possible legacy for Colchester from the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The key organisations on the Partnership are Colchester Borough Council (CBC), University of Essex, Colchester Garrison and Essex County Council 2012 Legacy Team. There is cross-party attendance from CBC councillors along with representatives from other organisations including Colchester United Community Sports Trust, NHS North East Essex and Colchester Blackwater Schools Sports Partnership.

3.2 The Partnership developed a Priority Action Plan with the focus for delivery on:

- Increasing **physical activity and sports participation**
- Supporting **volunteer activity** to improve the sporting infrastructure and develop community capacity
- Attracting **preparation and training camps**
- Improving **sports performance**
- Developing a **cultural programme or festival** to enhance Colchester's attraction as a destination
- Supporting the existing **destination development** plan to increase tourism capacity in the area
- Improving the **quality of the visitor experience** to encourage repeat visits and recommendations
- Facilitating and encouraging **local businesses** to realise opportunities to support, participate in and provide products and services to the Games
- Promoting healthy active lifestyles to improve overall **community health**

5. Strategic Plan references

5.1 This work directly contributes to the Healthy Living priority in the Council's Strategic Plan for 2009-2012. Within the Strategic Plan Action Plan there is an action to "Work with partners to deliver the London 2012 Partnership Plan".

6. Consultation

6.1 Informal consultation on the Priority Action Plan was carried out with the various partners who make up The Colchester Partnership.

7. Publicity considerations

7.1 All publicity tries to achieve a positive reflection of the Partnership, as partners working together rather than any one individual agency.

7.2 The Partnership has a logo, designed by Colchester Borough Council, which is used to promote the Olympic related projects and activities of the partners

7.3 Colchester Ahead of the Game website has been set up, primarily, to promote Colchester as a Pre-Games Training Camp location, but can also be used to highlight other Olympic related work

8. Financial implications

8.1 The Partnership does not have a budget. Some of the priorities in the action plan require budget, which will be held and managed by the relevant organisation.

8.2 In 2010/11 Colchester Borough Council and the University of Essex contributed £1000 each towards a joint Essex local authority fund, coordinated by the Essex County Council 2012 Legacy Team. This fund is used for the design and print of Essex Pre-Games Training Camp materials distributed to target countries, and for the costs of recruiting Danny Crates (former Paralympian) as ambassador to promote Essex Pre-Games Training Camps. As part of this agreement each authority can use Danny for specific functions for up to 2 full days per year. Danny performed the opening of the new Evolve gym at the University of Essex in September 2010 as part of this agreement.

- 8.3. Colchester Borough Council does not have any specific or budget allocated to “Olympic” work. Council budget has however been used as a contribution to deliver actions in the Partnership Plan e.g. adiZone at Monwick and Tour Series / Tour of Britain cycle events in 2009 & 2010.
- 8.4 The majority of Colchester Borough Council Olympic themed work e.g. organisation required for Urban Games, Walking your way to the Games, adiZone and Pre-Games Training Camps, is carried out by the Sports Development Manager. Other Council officers attend Partnership meetings and assist in project work, such as compiling the application to stage a leg of the Olympic Torch Relay. However, there is no specific Officer time allocated to “Olympic” related work or projects
