3. Substitutions

4. Urgent Items

To announce any items not on the agenda which the Chairman has agreed to consider because they are urgent and to give reasons for the urgency.

5. Have Your Say!

- (a) The Chairman to invite members of the public to indicate if they wish to speak or present a petition at this meeting either on an item on the agenda or on a general matter not on this agenda. You should indicate your wish to speak at this point if your name has not been noted by Council staff.
- (b) The Chairman to invite contributions from members of the public who wish to Have Your Say! on a general matter not on this agenda.

6. Declarations of Interest

The Chairman to invite Councillors to declare individually any personal interests they may have in the items on the agenda.

If the personal interest arises because of a Councillor's membership of or position of control or management on:

- any body to which the Councillor has been appointed or nominated by the Council; or
- another public body

then the interest need only be declared if the Councillor intends to speak on that item.

If a Councillor declares a personal interest they must also consider whether they have a prejudicial interest. If they have a prejudicial interest they must leave the room for that item.

If a Councillor wishes to make representations on an item on which they have a prejudicial interest they may do so if members of the public are allowed to make representations. In such circumstances a Councillor must leave the room immediately once they have finished speaking.

An interest is considered to be prejudicial if a member of the public with knowledge of the relevant facts would reasonably regard it as so significant that it is likely to prejudice the Councillor's judgement of the public interest.

Councillors should consult paragraph 7 of the Meetings General Procedure Rules for further guidance.

8. Exclusion of the public

The Committee resolved under Section 100A of the Local Government Act 1972 to exclude the public from the meeting for the following items as it involved the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in paragraph 1 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972.

21. Hackney Carriage/ Private Hire Appeal

The Committee considered a report by the Head of Environmental and Protective Services on an appeal against the Licensing and Enforcement Manager's decision not to grant a hackney carriage/private hire driver's licence because a conviction placed the applicant outside of the Council's pre-licensing conditions. The Protective Services Manager and the appellant attended, presented their cases and then withdrew for the Committee to consider the matter and make its determination.

RESOLVED that, having regard to the circumstances of the case, the appeal be upheld and a one year probationary licence be granted subject to the following condition that:-

If during the period of this probationary licence, the licence holder receives any criminal or motoring convictions or any fixed penalty notices or does not fully comply with the Council's hackney carriage and private hire driver and vehicle licensing conditions, then the licence will be automatically revoked.

22. Hackney Carriage/ Private Hire Driver's Appeal

The Committee considered a report by the Head of Environmental and Protective Services on an appeal against the imposition of penalty points in accordance with the Council's Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Drivers' and Operators' Penalty Point Scheme. The Protective Services Manager and the appellant attended, presented their cases and then withdrew for the Committee to consider the matter and make its determination.

RESOLVED

- (i) that the appeal be dismissed and the imposition of the points be upheld.
- (ii) In accordance with the Council's Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Drivers' and

Operators' Penalty Points Scheme the appellant's hackney carriage/private hire drivers' licence be automatically suspended for a period of 28 days but this suspension should not take place until the end of the 21 day appeal period.

RESOLVED that, having regard to the circumstances of the case, the Committee determined to suspend the Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Driver's Licence for a period of 28 days in accordance with paragraph 3(d) of the suspension process outlined in the Council's Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Drivers & Operators Penalty Point Scheme, and that the 28 day suspension period had already been served by the driver in question.
